You and several of your colleagues, preferably in consultation with your university's academic/instructional technologist, have tested out Annotation Studio, and you wish to have your own university-specific subdomain that continues to benefit from upgrades, development, and bug fixes from HyperStudio.
<i>Host your own (open source, install on your own server)</i>	Load and manage your own. Visibility controlled by groups you create and invite others to create.
